

DMVQ PRINTABLE CHECKLIST

Registration and Plate Renewal Checklist





Use this before renewing an Ohio vehicle registration or plate sticker through the official agency.



Scan for the full web guide

BRING THESE

Bring to renew your sticker

-  **Renewal notice or plate number**
Bring the mailed notice, current registration, or your plate number.
-  **Photo ID**
Ohio driver license, state ID, or another accepted photo ID.
-  **Proof of Ohio insurance**
Bring current insurance for the vehicle.
-  **Payment**
Registration fee, deputy registrar fee, local tax, and any added vehicle fees.

DECISION POINT

Check before you leave

- E-Check**
Summit County vehicles may need a current passing emissions test.
- Address**
Tell the clerk if your address changed so taxes and records are correct.

AT THE VISIT

Simple steps

- 1 Check whether the vehicle is due for E-Check.
- 2 Bring notice, ID, insurance, and payment.
- 3 Confirm address and vehicle details.
- 4 Apply the new sticker to the rear plate.

Avoid a return trip

Do not wait until the sticker is already expired.

Do not forget insurance proof.

Do not confuse registration renewal with title work.
